Q2 was delayed due to an accident on the start finish straight in the Supersport 300, it doesn't sound good when the ambulance has a police escort, and it's delayed by 20 mins but we hope all is okay with the riders involved and if not then our thoughts are with their family and friends.

This is top level over here and we have had previously 3 riders pass away from accidents or injuries from this championship.. it's a scary reality but it's the sport we love.

On a lighter note: For Q1 the team did awesome.. thanks to Jo and Robert Gösta in the pit lane, and Bente and Mikkel on the camera..

Just a casual tighten of the steering stem nuts in the middle of our 20minute quailifing.. they kept working loose, so hopefully fixed them good this time.. it's not pleasant feeling chatter under hard braking.. but it's not trouble for TR20 .. you'll hear about that on the video to come :-)) and got 6 laps in, for our 20 minutes.. also in Q2 we didn't start it till 7:10pm and fished at 7:30pm ! Never have I ridden in a race teach this late in the day !

So we're happy with today, we have room to improve yet, so hoping to do some more impressive times during our race tomorrow. Our race is at 11.50 local italy time.. So that's 9.50 NZ time..

The Surf 2 Surf Rescue Ride

Saturday and Sunday: 4th November 2017 and overnight option

The Surf 2 Surf Rescue Ride is now in it's 6th year and is organised as part of the fund raising activities of the Surf 2 Surf Rescue Ride Charitable Trust which is a non profit Trust that raises funds for Waikato based rescue services.

For the last five years the Ride has started at Waihi Beach from the Memorial RSA and ended at the Raglan Club with a BBQ and prize draw. From Waihi the ride proceeded to Paeroa, Te Aroha along Old Kaimai Rd to Te Poi and then along Te Poi South Rd to Highway 5 and onto Putaruru where the ride stopped for lunch at Putaruru Primary School who ran a fund raising lunch. Then it headed west to Arapuni and then across the Waikato River and onto Kihikihi, Te Awamutu and then up to Whatawhata and west to Raglan.

From feedback it has been decided to try running the Surf 2 Surf Ride for 2017 over a different route. A route starting in Hamilton.

For the 2017 ride we will start from the Hamilton Working Men's Club and head to Waikato Hospital to do a ride past of the Rescue Helicopter base and then proceed out on Collins Rd to Temple View, Ngahinapouri, Pirongia to Tihiroa where the ride will turn left and head across country via Wharepapa South to the Arapuni dam and then to Putaruru Primary School for the lunch stop where the prize draw will take place.

The afternoon part of the ride will follow the reverse of previous years morning ride and go via Te Poi, Old Kaimai Rd, Paeroa and Waihi and end at the Waihi Beach Memorial RSA. The RSA will support the efforts of the ride by having a live band at the Club for the night of the ride, I am also negotiating with them about offering ride participants a discount on meals in the restaurant after the ride.

There are a number of places that riders could stay in at Waihi Beach and other local places if they want to turn the ride into a weekend outing rather than just a day ride, the local Surf Life Saving Club has offered the use of it's facilities for riders, they charge \$20 per person for a bunk bed for the night this also includes full access to the bathroom facilities at the Club Rooms, I will have more details of the layout of the "bunk rooms" in the near future.

One of the reasons for starting the ride here in Hamilton is to give those who would like to participate on the ride easier access to the start point of the ride rather than having to ride to Waihi Beach to begin, it will also eliminate the dead end at Raglan for the end of the ride as Waihi Beach gives easy access to points both north and south for rider to disperse to after the ride.


The registration cost of the ride is \$20 per person, this will put every person who registers an entry into the main prize draw and a ride patch. Registration will be from 8.30 onwards, The HWMC will have a \$10 cooked breakfast available. The first group of riders will depart at around 9.45/9.50 with the 2nd and 3rd groups leaving at 5 minute intervals after that. We hope that this will work as a means of having slower riders followed by faster riders all arrive at Putaruru Primary for lunch at about the same time.

RIDE MARSHALS. We would like to hear from any club members who be able to assist with the running of the ride either in the capacity of a "Ride Marshal" or assisting with registrations at the Working Men's Club.

The Surf 2 Surf Charitable Trust also operates a pallet recycling business as another means of raising funds for local Waikato Rescue Services, the pallets are either on sold as whole pallets or broken down to both boxed and bulk firewood which is available from our base at 5 Green St in Frankton, the other side benefit of this operation is that we are keeping at least 100 cubic meters of wood each month from ending up in landfills, this we believe is a "win win situation" for both the environment as well as our customers.

DAMON REES - Australian media release - ASBK AUSTRALIA

The Rees family name has been bounced around road race paddocks for two generations now, both in New Zealand and Australia. First with Tony Rees and his numerous successes on a Superbike, and now with his son, Damon who is dominating (and won) the 2017 Kiwi Supersport Championship. We caught up with the rising talent from Aotearoa.

Damon, where is home for you? When did you become involved in racing?

And, what is it like to be constantly traveling?

"Home for me is Whakatane in the North Island on the idyllic Bay of Plenty. Travelling to Australia has become the norm for Dad (Tony Rees) and myself, as he has raced in Australia for most of his career.

"I have ridden motorcycles since I was five and got into road racing back in 2004 when I was 19, when Dad asked me to be his mechanic. After that, I was hooked to tarmac."

How does a Kiwi go in an Aussie paddock?

"Racing in Australia has been a buzz. Everyone has been great and we are all there for the same reason - to race and make great memories along the way. When the lights go green on the grid, we all want to win and there is a "take no prisoners" vibe!"

How would you describe the Supersport scene in NZ?

"Racing in NZ is fairly similar to Australia, and is similar numbers in the classes. The top ten riders in each class are super-fast, so you can't have an 'off weekend' or you'll be at the back!"

What do you do when you are not racing? Or in the Off Season?

"This year, I won't really have an off season, because once it's all wrapped up in Oz, I'll be straight into our season at home. I am sure it will definitely help me with the season having all the bike and track time in Australia. At home, its winter - no one rides until September/October. When I am not racing, I work as a mechanic for Mum and Dad at their Honda Dealership; Tony Rees Motorcycles, or riding a motocross bike for training."

You have had some pretty decent races this year, how would you say your season is progressing so far? How is the bike going?

"We were lucky enough to get hold of Giuseppe Scarcella's old CBR600RR that had a blown engine. We found a donor motor at a wreckers' in Sydney, fitted it and went

racing at Round 2 Wakefield Park Raceway! We are lucky enough to store the bike and gear at Bikebiz in Parramatta throughout the ASBK season."

"The 2017 ASBK season has had some ups and downs for me personally, but I feel we are getting better adjusting to all the new tracks, and my bike is running really well."

What are you most looking forward to for the remainder of this season?

"I look forward to every round as they come because they are all a new challenge for me, but mostly, I am looking forward to Phillip Island. The Island is an amazing track, I can't wait to have my first ride there."

What has been the highlight of 2017 ASBK for you personally?

"The highlight so far has been getting on the podium for Round 4 in Darwin, and I am looking forward to getting up there again next round!"

Most memorable 2017 race moment?

"So far? - Winning the 2017 New Zealand Supersport Championship!"

Damon Rees - ASBK Race Report - Hidden Valley Raceway, Darwin

Thursday June 6: Half day test

The Thursday, unofficial test was the hottest of the four days. I got out on track at around mid-day for my first 25 minute session, taking my time to learn yet another new track and this one is a fast track! I felt really good on the bike, improving my times every lap throughout the two sessions. I was positive going into timed practice on Friday.

Friday June 7: Timed Practice

1st session saw me going faster straight off the bat, setting the 7th fastest time, I worked hard and finished the third session 4th fastest of the day with a good race pace. I only made a few small adjustments to the bike going into qualifying day.

Saturday June 8: Official Qualifying

Qualifying 1: I straight off felt great, with the bike putting down 6th fastest time and a provisional 2nd row start.

Qualifying 2: We tried the softer option rear Pirelli, but only went half a tenth faster than my qualifying 1 time and luckily I kept my 6th spot on the grid! Qualifying times were super tight in the top 10. I felt confident that I could have a real go for the podium!

Sunday June 9: Race Day

Yet another sunny hot day was ahead, going in to race 1. I was very confident in my bike setup and fitness. I got off to a fairly good start coming round turn 1 in 6th swapping places multiple times, getting my way into 4th coming onto the front straightaway. I lost a spot to Marcus Chiodo going into turn 1, but as the laps wound down I made my way past Mason Coote and back into 4th, behind Chiodo then yet again lost 4th to Sam Lambert. Going into the final lap, I was right on the back of Lambert and Chiodo when they came together on the final corner, and I was able to pick up 4th position over the line and was awarded 3rd place for the race as Lambert was penalised with a jump-start. I finally achieved my first podium in ASBK and it was such an amazing feeling that my hard work was beginning to pay off!

Race 2: I got off to a great start, getting into third position on the opening half a lap then I was pushed wide going into turn 8, causing me to lose 2 more positions, going back to 6th then losing two more positions. There was a big pack of us from 2nd through to 8th. I was waiting to start my attack towards the front, when I made a massive mistake coming out of the draft down the front straight and ran wide, I went back to 15th place, ruining any chance of another podium. With only 6 laps left I made my way through the pack, getting myself up to 11th right behind 10th going over the finish line.

I gained a 7th overall for the weekend, and I'm still 10th in the championship, not quite where I wanted to be, but still another strong weekend improving, and getting closer to the front guys. It was amazing to get my first podium of the season and what a great weekend and an amazing week up in Darwin! Roll on the next round at Morgan Park Raceway!


