Interclub Challenge: AMCC-HMCC





Something a bit different for the coming 2020-21 season is the Battle Of The Clubs.

An Interclub Challenge involving AMCC and HMCC – whereby a Round from each Club's respective Club Series will count towards the Battle Of The Clubs points.

Round 2 of the AMCC Series (at HD on 18 October) will be the first Round And Round 2 of the HMCC Series (at Taupo on 8 November) will be the second and Final Round.

Points for the Battle Of The Clubs are independent of individual Club Series points.

However it is a great opportunity for a bit of interclub fun and engagement, and some more track time. For more details, see the Entry Forms (on the AMCC Website), or email roadrace@amcc.org.nz and they will address any queries or questions.

BATTLE OF THE CLUBS (AMCC, HMCC)

There is no restriction of the grade of rider or capacity of machine unless for reasons of safety as deemed by the Race Secretary or CoC or failure to comply with Machine Specifications and event.

Supplementary Regulations. Riders within the Sidecar and Supermoto classes are excluded from the points.

Each club member that competes will still retain their club points. However, each club's member's points will also be added to the club's Battle of the Clubs tally. The tally will then determine the overall winner for the series.

For each rider that attends an "away meeting", their points will be doubled in the tally. At the end of each round, the tallies will be totalled and averaged based on the number of riders who have competed from each club.

This is only eligible for Auckland Motorcycle Club and Hamilton Motorcycle Club members, any competitors from other clubs may enter the Battle of the Clubs but purchasing a club membership from either club they wish to represent.

Failure to comply with the MoMs or supplementary regulations will result in the rider losing their points for that race.

This decision will be at the discretion of the race officials with at least one member from each club.

AMCC hosted Round will be held at Hampton Downs Motorsport Park during AMCC Club round 2 on 18 October 2020. HMCC hosted Round will be held at Bruce McLaren Motorsport Park during HMCC Club final round on 8 November 2020 followed by prizegiving for the trophy will be done at the completion of the day.































Coromandel Overnighter

The morning of the annual Coromandel overnighter and its cold and raining. I toy with the idea of pyking out. But by the time my ride arrives (Kevin Hooper on his 1200 Bandit) I am hot in all my gear in the sun. An early arrival at Rototuna BP gives us time to gas up, grab a coffee and peruse fellow riders as they arrive. Ray, Steve P., Steve S, Terry. Mark Hatton's Bimota stirs a lot of interest and a small cluster assume hunched positions around it making appropriate noises.



Bruce and Michelle arrive, great to see them both, along with Liam, Michelle's son sporting a waterproof duffle bag which makes me nervous – does he know something I don't? They announce their intention to accompany the party only part of the way.





We rendezvous with Steve Walter at Mangateparu and a decision is made to travel via Tahuna and Netherton and ascend the peninsula via the east coast with a gas top up at Tairua. The field edges either side of the road around Turua are thick with daffodils yes I know you are bikers and don't give a shit but I am writing this so haha suck it up. The only wet roads we find are in the perpetual shade on the windies. Not much traffic either, not that traffic ever seemed to make a difference to the few who vanish over the horizon in short order.

We almost zip past the lunch stop at Hot Water Brewing Co and make a U-turn. The host there, eloquent enough to be an Aucklander, plies us with shot glasses of various flammable liquids and Kevin's eyes open wide and Ray coughs like a diesel train on start up. Brown paper wrapped bottles accompany us back to the table for a short wait for our food in the sunshine where we all fit around one table. A tray of only half consumed shot glasses of firewater are quickly commandeered after the neighbouring diners depart. Waste not want not.

A short verbal scuffle ensues in the carpark as we try and bully Bruce into continuing to Coromandel but no dice. Steve W says he is going to visit a new friend in the area but instead makes a new one, while we carry on to Kuaotunu to rest our bikes and backs.

Steve S and Ray embark on a spirited discussion on politics and the economy while Terry, Steve P, Kevin and Mark adopt horizontal positions on the grass in the sun and successfully fight off a nap. I was very tempted to do the same but the anticipated

struggle to get upright again was too awful to contemplate. We wait in vain for Steve W.

The descent into Coromandel always a highlight of a bike ride on the peninsula and Kevin didn't disappoint, passing cars I could run faster than (and



that is really saying something) and then cruising on neutral with minimal braking to the flat. He kept referring to my grabbing his waist as fear and I kept trying to explain that is my polite "giddy up" signal. I mean, it IS his ride and he is in charge but. . . .

When we arrive at Pat's Place there are a few vehicles already in the drive and a bit more activity than we usually encounter. Transpires our dear Pat has come out of a four year remission from cancer, her voice reduced to a whisper but still her old spark intact.

The group saunters down the main drag bee lining for the "bottom pub", looking pretty spic after a recent refurb, for the first drink of the evening. The second drink plus a plate of wedges in the window of the cosy Star and Garter where I spy our Auckland associates Bob and Brett approaching. I volunteer to go out and give them



a wave from the footpath and a round of suggestions to "show them your tits" ensues. A subsequent trawl through the available bottle stores sees a collection of Macs Ale six packs in various colours plus a bottle of Fat Bird, awful but effective.

Dinner at the "Top Pub" was stopped in its tracks by a bar packed out with giants, all celebrating some famous local boy done good, international basketball star. Ducking into the neighbouring restaurant we are told they are catering for 250 guests and we are welcome to wait. Of course we leave and return to the Star and Garter. The Chiefs vs Hurricane game on the big screen with supporters getting more and more drunk and loud makes conversation difficult and a splinter group braves the cold outside but we stay in touch with rude gestures through the glass.

A rat scuttles frantically across the beams above Pat's porch, banging his head twice, a morning rainbow and a pair of quarrelling birds who thrash around our space oblivious to us humans in an arc make for a magical morning after a bitterly cold night. The boys look a little worse for wear, while I had a warm night in the house. Sleep was the usual scarce commodity for most.

Steve W's Joanne was introduced to the eels at the bottom of Pat's garden. The eels turned their noses up at our offer of twisties and weet- bix but allowed themselves to be gingerly petted. We heard a story where a recent Chinese guest delightedly caught and killed one intending to eat it and narrowly escaped becoming a victim themselves and rightly so.

The return trip was uneventful, with a stop at the mussel farm separating us from the group until Kopu where we had another chat to Bob and Brett. Kevin took the scenic route home, dog-legging across the Hauraki plains with a stop at Ngatea and the fashionable Glory Co café, bursting at the seams with a quilting expo on across the road, but our arrival at 11.55 timed to perfection.

So two sprinkles of light rain, almost all dry roads, light traffic, no slips (though one stretch of road one way and controlled by lights but it allowed us to filter to the front of the queue) and no mechanical problems. One of the best Coro trips on record and more the pity for those that missed it. It may well have been our last at Pat's Place.

Another aircooled trial at Kimihia lakes.

With a great turnout of 24 riders and a break in the weather, Sunday's trial was a success by any measure.

With 4 Sections on the banks by the stairs and 4 up the northern track the event was easy walking distance for partners and spectators.

Tight turns and a few judicially placed logs made for some tricky off camber work amongst the trees. As the rain held off and the trees absorbed most of the weeks rain, there was a reasonable amount of grip available.

However any enthusiastic use of the throttle did produce the inevitable wheel-spin resulting in loss of forward motion. A requirement of aircooled trials is to "keep yer feet up" and non stop in the section.

As always, it is the riders who challenges themselves, so anyone can get started at the
