Club Secretary

Believe it or not, despite having the word "Secretary" in the title, this is not a role restricted to the female of the species this is an important role, keeping the communication channels open between the members, the committee, and the organisations we deal with. Time wise shouldn't be too onerous, an hour or so here and there, and best that you are available for all committee meetings – there is only one a month.

Membership Secretary

Holder of the membership Book, and recorder of members. You will be someone who attends most club nights, and is computer savvy enough to keep an eye on incoming emails and payments, to enable cards to be posted asap, as often they are time critical for members wishing to compete.

Newsletter Editor

You'll need to attend committee meetings, and assemble and format the magazine over the weekend following. You know what the newsletter looks like – we format it using Adobe InDesign, which I can train you in, if you are up for it. Needs a few hours commitment in the week between committee meeting and club night. Usually you will collect mag from printers, and post the ones requiring posting, although this part can be assigned to another person if it doesn't fit your schedule.

Treasurer

Ensures all income is accounted for, and banked, and all bills are paid on time. Maintain accurate records in Xero accounting system, provide monthly updates to committee, and prepare End of Year Balance sheet in February. Must be able to attend committee meetings.

Property Manager

Someone to keep an eye on building maintenance issues, and make sure that maintenance is done in a timely manner. This can be by personal skill, organizing working bees of club members, or organising professional services as appropriate. You will need to specify and obtain quotes for professional services, and obtain council permits if required.

Sound of Thunder 2020 Wrap up

A manic two weeks of bike building and racing is over.

I had planned to have the a new 1100 engine built, fitted and tested in January - weeks ahead of our annual trip to Christchurch for the Sound of Thunder Bears meeting. But, as usual, the Fusion finally fired into life the day before we left, zero testing. Steve was no different of course, as he was still spannering the latest configuration of his 750 an hour before we left.

Wednesday 6:10pm and we were off to catch up with the rest of our team (who, in contrast to the Bridge brothers were much more organised) for a 2:00am ferry crossing and an hour or so of sleep on the ferry. From there it was a quick 5 % hours' drive to Ruapuna arriving 18hours after departure to set up the F1E pits ahead of free practice Friday.

Friday was busy setting up and testing the Fusion. I built it in 2007 and it has since had many parts replaced but now has a new engine, forks and brakes - it's just like dads old



axe. I was happy with the progress by the end of the day.

Saturdays qualifying put me 4th on the grid, outside front row in my main event -Superstock Open. And that's how my meeting finished up, three 4ths and 4th overall. Add in a few black lines exiting the sweepers and the odd false neutral braking from high speed, it certainly made for heaps of fun alongside the odd panic moment.

Shane Graves had a high speed off in turn one after another bike took his line in his second race. He suffered a broken knuckle, destroyed helmet and concussion but was rewarded with a trip to hospital for overnight observation by a couple very fit lady medics. He made

it back to catch some racing and prize giving.

Mike Lind put in some great rides on his fast and sexy Bimota DB1 until a crash put an end to it before the last round. Unfortunately the DB1 lying on the track and some lacklustre flag waving resulted in Steve Degroot clipping the rear tyre and hitting the deck also. Steve's Ducati TT2 was repaired for some good finishes in the last round.

Both Frilly and Dave suffered a few mechanical gremlins which they got on top of and put in some good rides.

Then there was Steve Bridge who put on his usual show of dominance with a win first up on the 750. However, this was soon followed up by a reasonable off which would put most riders out of contention for the rest of the weekend. Instead, Steve spent Saturday evening out in the rain repairing the bike for another two wins on the Sunday. Steve's efforts on the 1199 Panigale were similar, with a reasonable off wiping out all the controls on one side. A hectic repair was required to get him back out to the front of the F1 race only for him to do it all again in a high side witnesses described as a 'huge off'. That still wasn't enough to deter him from making another repair and getting back out to the front of the next race. Almost 30 years after Steve's first Sound of Thunder, the time, sweat, blood and dedication he puts into racing is stunning.

Great results from other Hamilton Club members as well.

BURT MUNRO FEBRUARY 2020 RACE REPORT

DAVID LEWIS - TEAM ILROS (IT'S LIKE RACING ONLY SLOWER)

I always fancied the idea of competing in the "BURT" and being 60 in February it seemed like a good reason to do it. Luckily for me a group of old friends thought so too, so with 4 in the tow vehicle and 2 on bikes we set off for Invercargill.

I raced my CRF450R - sponsors Bridgestone Tyres (Whites Powersports) Honda Hamilton.

Entered in Hill Climb, Beach race and Street race

We took the scenic mountain route on the way down, just managing to beat the floods and made it down to a surprisingly cold and windy Invercargill. But an old Northern Pom does not complain about the weather!

Wednesday morning: Teratonga Track day

We fitted the tallest gearing we had and did a couple of sessions to check bike and rider!

Wednesday afternoon: visited Bluff Hill Climb to make notes and have a few slow runs up the hill on Geoff's Africa Twin. Looked like a "good" hill and seemed a bit easier to learn than Quine Road.

Dodgy weather in the evening so 7-9pm Southland Honda kindly allowed us to share their workshop space so I could prepare the bike for the Hill Climb. Changes to gearing and fitting wet wheels.

Thursday morning: off to a very wet and windy Bluff. On arrival we heard that a camper van had been up the hill with no fuel cap fitted spilling diesel on to the road. Not good for rider morale. The Southland MCC got the job sorted quickly with 2 fire engines and lots of volunteers. I walked up the hill so I could see for myself and they had done a magic job of cleaning up the spill. It's a very steep hill, so walking up it was good motivational exercise.

I had some half decent runs, and I think I got 4th fastest time for Motard.

A great day.

Friday morning: Worked on the bike in the motel car park converting over for beach race use.

Friday afternoon: Beach race. Fantastic atmosphere. Lots of competitors and spectators. We were treated to low level passes and a really good display by a throbbing piston powered stunt plane. Gave me goose bumps and got everyone in the mood to race.



Had 2 laps practice, but woefully under- prepared with my riding gear. The sand from the other bikes rear wheels really stings and bruises any part of the body not covered!! Now I know why the seasoned riders were wearing leathers or endure jackets.

One Mile dash Race, saw me make a great start but slowly make my way to the back of the pack. I was surprised by the speeds obtainable on wet, rutted sand – 150kph plus!

Saturday morning: Converted bike back for Street race. Changing wheels and gearing etc.

Saturday afternoon: walked

the Street Race course. Looked the safest street circuit I have seen, mainly around an industrial site.

Sunday morning: This was the highlight of my week – the Street Race.

Unfortunately delayed due to high winds and heavy rain. But once underway the race was as good and exciting as I expected. I qualified 12th out of 20. Happy with that – this gave me a very good outside grid position for the actual race. I got 3 good starts, 2 11th placings and 1 10th place. I held 9th until the second corner from the finish.

Didn't piss off too many of the younger quicker riders, all in all a fantastic race experience.

In addition to the racing, we had time to check out the fantastic bike and truck museums. The whole Burt Munro event was an amazing experience - I would highly recommend it!

FINDING FORMER MEMBERS


Please talk to acquaintances and spread the word around, particularly to help find those no longer active in motorcycling, who may not be aware it is coming up.
