# **Pukekohe Motul 6Hour**

Getting to the start line

I'm not sure where to start on this one. From the very beginning, well before I became involved, this has been a battle. Firstly, is the ongoing issues Pukekohe Motorsport has had to get a permit to hold an official race meeting. I raced Puke often way back when, and I did not perceive it was any riskier than other tracks. Some did and it was scratched. Fair enough I am sure the powers to be at the time knew more than me and had good reason. We should always be progressing safety to keep up with



speeds. As most industry safety policies state, "You must take practical steps to reduce risk" Motorcycle racing is no different. Since then, Pukekohe and Gary Sterling and invested a huge amount of money and effort into improving the track and how it is run. Driving round the new layout now it is not immediately evident how much work has been done until it is pointed out this is no minor touch up. But there are still small voices in the background and naysayers posting comments who believe this track should not be raced. Have they visited the track recently? Maybe but personally, I do not think this is a safety issues for them anymore it's a bigoted view that they will

was kind. The extra tyre issues that these teams had to contend with was massive. The rain cleared although there was just the wind to contend with times steadily dropped and with the last hour I saw some 1.09sec lap times on the timing screen not bad time let alone after 5 hours. So, the final lap came to the relief of everyone most of all the teams of which everyone crossed the line!

#### My Refection

Obviously, congratulations to the winning team "I Tools" great riding but just as importantly in an endurance event fantastic teamwork by everyone within your garage on top of that your other 3 Tools taking out third place! a very slick well-prepared team all-round. Also 2nd place going to ETA6 who crossed the line just 14seconds

never alter. In saying this though never become complacent Pukekohe is safer than it was but racing Motorcycles is dangerous. Listen to briefings carefully, repeat critical safety issues to yourself. There are many hiccups at the track that can distract you. Placings, points, mechanical problems, other racers but do not forget the core safety rules.

This dose not mean job done we will always consider any practical safety improvements that can be made

#### The Race

If cyclones are an issue to you then yes, we had weather issues. After riders did some sighting/qualifying laps a vote was taken on how we should proceed, and it was a unanimous thumbs up. As the flag dropped it was wet the dry then semi wet then wet dry wet semi dry wet dry wet dry. I raced MotoTT first 6Hour and have spannered at the others, there is a lot happening and so many factors to consider but our weather

later well-done Travis, Ed, Ash. From my experience the podium is just and added bonus the biggest buzz is the team finishing which is no easy task. All of our teams did this with every rider still circulating. Not every bike did, as you would expect in the conditions there were a few spills and couple of very second-hand bikes. Importantly though no injuries. So in a cyclone which closed the Harbour Bridge, felled trees, cut off power, on a track that some still perceive unsafe a bunch of dedicated Motorcycle lovers ranging in experience from wrinkled to newbies completed an endurance race that left everyone involved smiling. If this dose not make you smile that doesn't both us.

Yes, we plan to do it again. I want to race it for a start. So make a plan to enter the next one it is the most inclusive team building event you will do. Even just as a thank you to your usual crew. Motorcycle racing appeals to a lot of people from those that live and breath it to others who may not even ride bikes. Watching is great but being involved adds an extra element.
