HMCC July 2025 Road Ride Sunday July 13th

It was a short day, so we planned a short(ish) ride around the Waikato basin.

We came out on the better side of conflicting weather forecasts ... And, it didn't rain at all. Some roads were damp, some weren't.

We had a good turn out of club members and other riders joining in, with a good variety of bikes. We headed out from BP Tristram through Hillcrest and the Expressway to Matangi and out to Te Miro We turned left off of Maungakawa Rd onto Brunskill Rd. This comes out at Whitehall, which we passed through to reach Karapiro Rd. We decided to lunch in Matamata, so we rode down Buckleys Rd and past Hobbiton and into Matamata. A busy cafe and a warm day.

The ride home took us to Hamilton by way of Scotsmans Valley Rd. A good short ride for a short winter's day.

We're planning a longer ride planned for August; an overnighter to Coromandel town.

HMCC August Road Ride Saturday/Sunday 16/17th August

Leaving from BP Rototuna/Horsham Downs at 10 a.m.

Terry Stevenson will be leading the ride. I've had an operation recently and won't be able to ride at this time. I'm planning on driving over to Coro.

We'll be staying at the Tasman Holiday Park near the centre of Coromandel and a short walk to the top pub for a meal, refreshment and their open fire; well, it is usually well alight when we get there for dinner.

I sent out a text to those on my Road Rider's text list last week and have had some responses.

I will be booking some core accommodation. This year, I'm booking the Luxury Villa as it has a very good winter special deal going. It's a four b/r villa with two bathrooms, a lounge and a kitchen, BBQ and deck.

The rooms have all bedding & towels provided and the rooms and will sleep up top seven, as follows:

- 1. two single beds
- 2. a King bed that can split into two singles
- 3. a Queen and a single
- 4. a Queen (this is already reserved).

The cost for the Villa will be about \$50 each for rooms 1, 2 & 3 (two to a room).

History shows the accommodation isn't heavily booked this time of year. Currently, they have some very good deals on units with two separate rooms and beds with bathrooms. These will cost about \$55 to \$60 per person, depending if the special deals remain special.

In other words, commit now and I'll book extra if there are more than what the Villa can take.

If the weather is a wipe out, the accommodation can be cancelled 3 days before. We should have a strong idea whether that option will be required by the Wednesday morning before the weekend.

We won't defer to the following weekend, as that is the weekend the Club is having an Open Day (Saturday 23rd) for people to see the clubroom renovations. If we do re-plan the ride, it would be for the weekend of September 6/7th.

I'll send out one text reminder on Monday, 11th August.

This event is suitable for all trials bikes and all skill levels.


